Overview of SLEI

The School Librarian Evaluation Instrument (SLEI) is recommended by the Georgia Library Media Association (GLMA) as the evaluation tool for library media specialists. Grounded in standards from the American Association of School Libraries (AASL) and the International Society of Technology Educators (ISTE), the SLEI is an evaluation instrument that ensures consistency and comparability across Georgia districts, based on a common definition of highly qualified school library media specialists who support and enrich school environments.

School library media specialists can use the SLEI as a self-assessment tool to review and enhance current programs and practices. In addition, the SLEI is an excellent way to inform all stakeholders about the role of the library media programs and library media specialists. This instrument can be used as a catalyst for open discussions among library media specialists and their administration. Additionally, districts can adopt the SLEI for all library media specialists. Currently, at least 16 Georgia school districts have adopted SLEI as the evaluation instrument for library media specialists.

How to Use This Crosswalk

In the crosswalk below, you will find the interconnections between the School Librarian Evaluation Instrument, the Future Ready Librarians Framework™ and the ISTE Standards for Educators. The SLEI works as a bridge between the broad overview of the Future Ready framework and the more detailed ISTE Educator Standards.
